A clone of their up-and-coming Sky Rocket II model, *Tempesto* launches riders three times using the company's tried-and-true LIM technology. After being sent toward the blue sky on the final 63mph launch and giving riders a panoramic view of the surrounding area (all at an impressive 150 feet), the train enters a slow barrel roll. A slight pause at the exit of this inversion gives riders a moment of respite before it plummets them down into a rather forceful loop-the-loop, adding a satisfying finishing touch to the coaster

Enthusiasts who were on site for the event were given some of the first rides of the day and many individuals agreed that it delivered on many levels. The smooth launches, balance of elements, and fun theming all meld together to create one of the most unique shuttle coasters in the Mid-Atlantic.

Many individual ACE members took advantage of the numerous rerides given,

trying out each seat and row on the train. The front and back of the train each give it's own unique character to the overall experience and is worth checking out.

The over-the-shoulder comfort collars are soft padded to allow for pain-free maneuverability during the coaster's twisty elements while the single lap bar restraint allows for some surprising airtime on the third launch and plummet back to the station.

In addition to the morning rides, ACE members were treated to a special commemorative wristband, a taste test of a new panini to be showcased in Festa Italia, and a healthy dose of networking during loading cycles with park staff, other enthusiasts and Premier representatives themselves.

A huge thank you to Busch Gardens for inviting us to the media day event. We look forward to future opportunities to support the park!

## **Fury 325 Takes Over By Storm**

Fury Fever hit ACE Mid-Atlantic even before the season started. Talks about a new giga coaster coming to Carowinds spread long before the company could even officially announce it. A spiritual successor to *Leviathan* in the states? That was all it took for many to get excited for the tallest, traditional coaster in the world.

But, how would this ride compare to the reigning champ of high speed thrills? Could it outshine the king of the Mid-Atlantic region, the one and only Intimidator 305?

What about its brethren up north? Would it take its place as rightful heir in the B&M hyper dynasty or would it fail under pressure? Could this really be the B&M to top all B&M coasters?

These questions lingered and so, as any self-respecting enthusiast would do, many made the trek down south just to find out.

Calling into work and school sick, ACE members packed up their cars on a Tuesday night and made the modestly, short drive down to the NC-SC border. As daylight became nighttime and members settled into their hotel rooms, many could see the ride's signature lift hill glowing in the darkness, ready to do battle against an army of enthusiasts who have traveled the world and would be giving the coaster a watchful eye.

As morning rose and an overcast set in, members made their way over to

the event. Friendly chatter and eager anticipation filled the open air as press, enthusiasts, and more mingled and conversed about the beautiful teal, steel structure erupting out of the ground.

After a press meeting to introduce the ride, ACE members were given the chance to get strapped in and take the trip through the beehive. Up the chain hill the train went (a welcome change to the 300 foot cable lifts many have become accustomed to). Slowly, the train crested over the hill and then, as quick as it could be seen up there, it was gone.

Members were already making their way to the turnaround -- this thing had speed Caught off guard, members were treated to a generous airtime treat on the ride's overbanked turn. There was no time for second thinking as the train hurled itself toward the 'hive', careening under the new entrance and on its way back to the final airtime hills.

Enthusiasts already knew it at the first drop: this was a winner. Fury had successfully buzzed its way past the competition and into the hearts of many. The fever was here to stay.

Members began to converse about their experiences. Among chatter, enthusiastic murmers of Top 3 could be heard, while many others were already planning their trips back later on that summer.
